Mission Team Members: Pastor Ken Frederick (Blackville First) and son David; Pastor Charlie Lucas and Bamberg First member Bill Zion; Kevin Judy, (Mt. Tabor).

Bean; Brazilian men who are reaching and shepherding new believers ("local missionaries")

Purpose: To help reach the unreached people group, the Quilombolas and their neighbors, the Ribeirinho, in the Amazon region of Brasil.

Plans: Pastors Ken and Charlie will teach and train the local missionaries September 9-13. Then each mission team member will accompany the local missionaries (divided into small groups) and travel by boat on the river and by foot through the jungle to visit and share Jesus with the Quilombolas and Ribeirinho Sept. 14-17.

Why are we doing this? The IMB targeted 100 unreached people groups in the Americas and asked churches and associations to adopt a group, partner with others, pray for them, and go to them to share the Gospel and make disciples. On January 29, 2019, our association voted to adopt the Quilombolas.

THESE MEN ARE GOING. WILL YOU PRAY FOR THEM?

Pray for: health concerns; favor in the eyes of the people they will meet; impact for eternity in the "uttermost" places; safety; believers to continue to multiply (in July, twelve people prayed to receive Christ); the teaching and training to be effective.

Pray that: the door that is open will be one that no man can close (God's power is needed); those on the mission trip will return and resemble our Lord Jesus more than ever before.

How can we reach out to a people group previously protected by their government from outside interference? We can go when one Quilombolas person asks us to come. One asked! Others and I are praying. Will you join us in praying?

Prisoner Packets due Nov. 11-13

Approved Packing List

From SC Department of Corrections

(Include only these items):

- One black non-retractable pen (NO wire clip)
- One writing tablet no larger than 5 1/2 x 8 inches (no wire bound books, no composition books, and no post-it notes)
- One factory-sealed adult toothbrush
- Five First-Class #10 Stamp-embossed envelopes
- Two rolls of candy (LifeSavers; Mentos, Breath Savers only; no Smarties, no Sweetarts, no Rolos, no Starbursts, no Tic Tacs, no Necco Wafers)
- One 3.2 oz. to 6 oz. bar of soap (no travel size, no unwrapped, unboxed bars)
- One 4 oz.- 6 oz. toothpaste (no travel size)
- One gallon size zipper bag

All items must fit in the zipper bag with zipper closed securely. Do not include washcloths, toothbrush holders, floss, or combs.
